INSIDE THE GAME

Lions eyeing 1st win in regular-season finale vs. Seton Hall Prep

The Lions have one last chance to end their worst losing streak in 53 years and notch their first victory of the regular season on Friday when Seton Hall Prep in a North Jersey Super Football Conference division game at Seton Hall Preparatory School.

The Lions are 0-8 on the season after losing games to DePaul (48-7), Paramus Catholic (22-14), Archbishop Wood (Pa.) (22-20), St. Joseph-Montvale (31-7), Don Bosco Prep (37-0), Delbarton (27-0), Bergen Catholic (14-6), and St. Peter's Prep (43-6), respectively. The Lions are in the midst of their longest losing streak since 1965, when the team — known as Our Lady of the Lake — went 0-8 and was in the middle of its state-record losing streak of 32 games that ended in the third week of the 1966 season.

The Lions want to end their current losing streak — and avoid going 0-9 for the first time since 1964 — by beating the Pirates in their third regular-season meeting ever against the Essex County school. The Lions won the first two contests by scores of 19-7 and 49-28, respectively.

In order to earn a win over Seton Hall Prep, the Lions know they have to execute during all 48 minutes after hanging tough with St. Peter's Prep — ranked No. 2 in the state by Max Preps and NJ.com — for one quarter before dropping a 43-6 contest.

The Lions only trailed St. Peter's, 7-6, through the first quarter after senior running back Jacob Huhn scored a touchdwn on a 5-yard run. The Lions had a chance to tie, but they misplayed the snap on the extra-point attempt and wound up throwing an incomplete pass on the play. Unfortunately, the Lions could not contain St. Peter's Prep, as the Marauders scored 26 points in the second quarter en route to the victory.

As for Seton Hall Prep, it is coming off a 45-10 loss to St. Joseph-Montvale. The Pirates (4-4) are looking to finish the regular season with a winning record under first-year head coach Bill Fitzgerald.

NEXT LEVEL LIONS



Since 2012, the Lions have had 53 players go on to play college football.

Among this 53-man group, 2014 graduates Noah Brown and Ryan Izzo have gone on to be drafted to play in the National Football League after enjoying standout careers at Pope John and at their respective NCAA Division I universities.

Brown is in his second year with the Dallas Cowboys after being picked in the seventh round by them in the 2017 NFL Draft. Following a three-year career at Ohio State University, Brown became Pope John's first graduate to play in the NFL, seeing time in 13 games with the five-time Super Bowl champion Cowboys and making four receptions for 33 yards while playing 279 total snaps.

Izzo is looking to become the second Pope John graduate to play in the NFL after being drafted in the seventh round by the New England Patriots in April. Izzo is coming off a three-year career at Florida State University, where he made 54 catches for 761 yards and six touchdowns while also being a terrific blocker.

While Brown and Izzo are competing at the highest level of football, the Lions currently have 34 alums playing in college. HEAD COACH BRIAN CARLSON

Brian Carlson was named the sixth head coach in the history of the Pope John XXIII Regional High School/Our Lady of the Lake football program on April 1, 2011.

Since superseding the legendary Vic Paternostro, who led the Lions to 20 state championships in 43 seasons, Carlson has been putting his stamp on the program.

Entering his eighth season this year, Carlson has guided the Lions to a 46-27 record, three NJAC American Division titles and a Non-Public, Group 3 championship game appearance in 2013.

In 2014, Carlson helped the Lions elevate the program by having them face some of the best teams in the state in Paramus Catholic and DePaul. After two years of only having these two powerhouses on a schedule primarily filled with public schools from Sussex and Morris counties, the Lions started playing an exclusive non-public school schedule that featured some of the top private schools in the Northeast.

Now, the Lions play and scrimmage natonally-known teams such as Bergen Catholic, Paramus Catholic, St. Joseph-Montvale, Don Bosco Prep, DePaul, St. Peter's Prep, St. John's College High School (Washington, D.C.), Archbishop Wood (Pa.), and Malvern Prep (Pa.) on an annual basis.

Off the field, Carlson helped the Lions excel in the classroom and in the community.

Academically, 53 Lions have gone on to continue their academic and athletic careers at the NCAA level. This fall, 20 members from the Class of 2018 will be playing on the college gridiron, with 14 of them competing at the NCAA D-I or Division II level. The Class of 2018 also earned over \$2 million in athletic and Merit scholarships. In addition, the Lions finished the 2017-18 school year with a combined 3.05 GPA. Moreover, 38 percent of the team (out of 95 players) was recognized for Academic Achievement (either Distinguished Honors, 1st Honors or 2nd Honors).

In the community, the Lions have volunteered their time to local charities and organizations, such as SCARC and senior citizen homes.

Another big achievement of Carlson's at Pope John was forming the Jr Lions Athletics Program — a program that offers six sports to boys and girls in grades K-8 who attend Pope John High School, Pope John Middle School and Reverend George A. Brown Memorial School while modeling them after the way Pope John runs its varsity squads.


Carlson laid the groundwork for the program by using the vision he has for the football team as the "template." The football team is run by faith-based principles, is committed to the highest academic standards, and thrives on competition, otherwise known as "Faith, Family, Football."

The program has taken off since its inception in 2017, as it has over 400 students competing, including over 200 for football.

Before coming to Pope John, Carlson spent the 2010 season as the linebackers coach at Don Bosco Prep and was previously the head coach of Kean University's football program for eight seasons from 1992-99. During his tenure, he helped the school win a NJAC co-championship and the ECAC South Bowl championship.

A native of Saddle Brook, Carlson is a 1979 graduate of Paramus Catholic and a 1983 graduate of Montclair State University, where he played as a line-backer/defensive end for four years and was captain of the team as a senior. He earned his BS degree in Economics. He was also the CEO of Parisi Sports Inc., a posiion he held for over 10 years.

In addition to coaching, Carlson is a business teacher at Pope John and has served as the department's chair for the last three years. He lives in Sparta with his wife, Donna and their two children Brendan and Kate.

THE SERIES VS. SETON HALL PREP

GAME 1 RECAP: DePAUL DOWNS LIONS IN SEASON OPENER

SPARTA — In a much anticipated season opener, the Pope John Lions had a tough time against DePaul, as the defending Non-Public, Group 3 champion Spartans handed the Lions a 48-7 defeat at Pope John XXIII Regional High School.

With the defeat, the Lions have now lost the last six meetings against DePaul and have dropped to 5-7 in the all-time series. Despite the amount of points and yardage allowed, the Lions had some solid performances from junior safety Mike DeNucci (team-high 10 tackles), senior linebacker Chris Sabo (seven tackles) and senior defensive lineman Ireland Burke (three tackles for loss).

GAME 2 RECAP: LIONS' LATE RALLY FALLS SHORT IN LOSS TO PARAMUS CATHOLIC

WARMINSTER, Pa. — Desperately looking for their first win of the year, the Lions came up short in achieving that goal after losing to Archbishop Wood, 22-20, at William Tennent High School.

With the defeat, the Lions have dropped to 0-3 on the season for only the fifth time in program history and the first time since 1965, when the team — known as Our Lady of the Lake — was in the middle of its state-record losing streak of 32 games that ended in the third week of the 1966 season.

The Lions had high hopes to avoid a three-game losing streak after jumping out to a 6-0 lead in the first quarter after senior wide receiver Ryan Dengler hauled in a 74-yard touchdown pass from senior quarterback Niko Hroncich. But, the Lions allowed two straight touchdowns to Archbishop Wood — a two-time defending PIAA 5A state champion — to slip into a 14-6 hole The Lions cut the deficit to one after junior running back Nafis Matthews bolted for a 64-yard TD run.

Unfortunately, the Lions went into halftime trailing, 16-13, after being called for a safety while intentional grounding in the end zone at the start of their drive in the second quarter.

In the third quarter, Hroncich gave the Lions a 20-16 lead after finding junior wideout Menyelek Ward for a 13-yard TD. However, the Lions let the lead slip away after Archbishop's Tom Santiago ran for the second of his two touchdowns on the day from 22 yards out and they failed to get out of their own territory on their final three drives of the game.

Hroncich finished 10-of-27 passing with 192 yards and two TDs, Matthews had 102 yards rushing on nine carries, and Dengler had 98 yards receiving on five receptions to lead the Lions' offense in the defeat.

Junior linebacker/safety Mike DeNucci paced the defense with 13 tackles and an interception. Senior linebacker Chris Sabo also had 10 tackles and a forced fumble for Pope John.

GAME 4 RECAP: LIONS DROP TO 0-4 WITH LOSS TO RIVAL ST. JOE'S

MONTVALE — The Lions could not crack the win column and avoid their first 0-4 start in 53 years on Saturday, as they lost to rival St. Joseph-Montvale, 31-7, at St. Joseph Regional High School.

The Lions are winless in their first four games for the first time since 1965, when the team — known as Our Lady of the Lake — was in the middle of its state-record losing streak of 32 games that ended in the third week of the 1966 season. The loss to St. Joe's also dropped them to 0-8 against the Green Knights in their all-time series dating back to 2000.

The Lions thought they could pull out a comeback win against the Green Knights in a rematch of last year's Non-Public, Group 3 semifinals.

Huhn, senior quarterback Niko Hroncich and senior wide receiver Taj Jones led the offense in the loss. Hroncich completed 18-of-31 passes for 188 yards, while Jones hauled in six catches for 102 yards and Huhn finished with 28 rushing yards on nine carries.

Senior defensive back Anthony Holmes paced the Lions' defense, as he made eight tackles and intercepted a pass, which he returned for 19 yards.

Senior free safety Zachary Cuttito also came away with eight tackles, junior linebacker Mike DeNucci had seven tackles and a blocked punt, and junior defensive tackle Jasmir Taylor recorded two sacks and six tackles in the defeat.

The combo of senior quarterback Niko Hroncich and senior wide received Ryan Dengler paced the offense. Hroncich completed 8-of-23 passes for 61 yards, while Dengler caught three passes for 41 yards.

Senior defensive lineman Ireland Burke stood out on the Lions' defense, as he made eight tackles and one sack in the defeat. Linebackers Mike DeNucci and Chris Sabo had seven tackles apiece for Pope John in the defeat.

For Don Bosco, the win put the team at 3-2 on the year. The victory was also the 400th in program history, which started back in 1948.

GAME 6 RECAP: TURNOVERS SPOIL LIONS' SHOT AT 1ST WIN VS. DELBARTON

SPARTA — The mistakes that have plagued the Lions all season long continued to happen on Saturday during their Homecoming against Delbarton, as they lost to the rival Green Wave, 27-0, at Pope John XXIII High School and still remained without a win on the season.

With the loss, the Lions fell to 0-6 on the year. The defeat marked the first time the Lions lost six games in a season since 1966 and only the fifth time in program history.

Offensively, the Lions committed six turnovers while only mustering 226 yards of total offense on nine drives.

Trailing, 10-0, Pope John had two golden opportunities in the second quarter to score that it could not capitalize on.

The first came during a Delbarton punt return when the ball was ruled to hit Delbarton's returner before he just let it go by him, and Pope John was able to recover it at the Delbarton 40. That Lions drive ended when they could not earn a first down on a fourth-and-2.

That opportunity ended when a fumble on first-and-goal from the 5-yard line was scooped and scored by Michael Jarmolowich for an 85-yard touchdown and a 17-0 Delbarton lead.

In the third quarter, the Lions forced two turnovers — an interception by junior defensive back Miguel Lopez when he perfectly read an inside breaking route and jumped in front of a Delbarton wide receiver and a forced fumble by senior defensive lineman Louis Montana that was recovered by senior linebacker Chris Sabo. However, they could not take advantage of them due to two turnovers they committed as well on their ensuing drives.

Defensively, the Lions did manage to force four turnovers, but allowed two touchdowns and two field goals.

GAME 8 RECAP: LIONS ALLOW SECOND-QUARTER SURGE TO ST. PETER'S, SLIP TO 0-8

SPARTA — The Lions hung tough for one quarter against state-ranked St. Peter's Prep, but the Marauders scored four touchdowns in the second quarter en route to topping Pope John, 43-6, at Pope John XXIII High School.

With the loss, the Lions fell to 0-8 on the year. The defeat marked the first time the Lions lost eight games in a season since 1966 and only the fifth time in program history.

Coming off a tough 14-6 loss to top-ranked Bergen Catholic on the road, the Lions looked as if they were going to give St. Peter's — a team ranked No. 2 in the state by both Max Preps and NJ.com — a run for its money after trailing, 7-6, through the first quarter.

2017 POPE JOHN XXIII HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

The Lions had a lot of highs and lows during their 6-4 season in which it finished second in the North Jersey Super Football Conference United White Division and reached the Non-Public, Group 3 semifinals for the second consecutive season.

During the season, the Lions reached as high as No. 4 in the News12 Varsity Tri-State Top 20 poll, No. 6 in the NJ.com Top 20 poll, No. 7 in the USA Today High School Sports Super 25 East Regional rankings and No. 98 in the High School Football America Top 100.

They accomplished these feats by winning their first five games in a row, which included their first victory over an out-of-state opponent (Bishop McNamara of Maryland) and their first win over Paramus Catholic since they started playing the Paladins annually four years ago. They also took Bergen Catholic, the consensus No. 1 team in the Tri-State area, down to the wire in a regular season clash on the road before falling, 20-19, to the Crusaders — the eventual Non-Public, Group 4 champions.

The Lions ended up losing four of their last five games to St. Joseph-Montvale (twice), Bergen Catholic and



DePaul — the eventual Non-Public, Group 3 champion.

The Lions' lone victory during this stretch was a 53-7 win over Donovan Catholic in the first round of Non-Public, Group 3. Their season ended with a 28-7 loss to St. Joe's in the Non-Public, Group 3 semifinals.
